### **Community Facilities**

An essential element in creating a successful mixed-use development as a livable place is a complete framework of community facilities and amenities. Public parks, schools, community centers, police and fire services, and emergency services are fundamental to support the creation of a mixed-use community.

This Plan proposes new public amenities and facilities, including new parks and open spaces, pedestrian links, bicycle paths, and public use spaces that support Long Branch's growth. These new facilities will contribute to the livable and walkable environment that is a desirable place to live, work, and play for existing and future residents and employees.

The Long Branch Community Recreation Center, the Long Branch Senior Center and the Long Branch Outdoor Pool are existing public facilities within the Plan area. Takoma Park Recreation Center and the Schweinhaut Senior Center are some of the public and community facilities near the Plan area.

#### Objectives

- Encourage a diversity of public facilities in the sector plan, including recreation and activity centers, child daycare centers, religious institutions and emergency services.
- Integrate public facilities into mixed-use buildings throughout the sector plan.
- Provide new services that support elderly care and child care services.
- Use the optional method provisions for the inclusion of public facilities and amenities in the Plan area's new development projects.

#### **Public Schools**

There are two schools located within the Long Branch Sector Plan area and five schools outside the boundary but within the study area. Montgomery Blair High school is located in close proximity to the study area boundary. The area's schools are a part of the Down County Consortium (DCC) which consists of five high schools—Montgomery Blair, Albert Einstein, John F. Kennedy, Northwood, and Wheaton—and students engage in a choice process, ranking their preference among the five choices. DCC high schools have focused their reform efforts on building smaller learning communities within the high schools that serve a very diverse student population residing in the Wheaton/Silver Spring area. Unique ninth grade programs are designed to meet the academic needs of entering freshman while, simultaneously, connecting these students with the adults in their school. Following the ninth grade program, students in the DCC move into another form of a smaller learning community. Students choose from among a series of themed academies that focus on the application of school-based learning to higher education and the workforce.

### Highland View Elementary School - #784

**Capital Project:** Projections indicate enrollment at Highland View Elementary School will exceed capacity by four classrooms or more by the end of the six-year period. An FY 2010 appropriation was approved for facility planning to determine feasibility, scope, and cost for a classroom addition. A date

for the addition will be considered in a future CIP. Relocatable classrooms will be used until additional capacity can be provided. The school has also been recommended for restroom renovations.

Capital Project: Renovations are expected to be completed in the 2012-2013 school year.

The reason for a possible assessment is based primarily on the development of the Purple Line. The Purple Line will provide easy pedestrian access to facilities from a much larger service area than previously available. The development of the Purple Line may also increase the Plan area's population.
