
Rock Spring Break Out Table Comments

Strengths:

- No/Limited access to Metro


Wants:

- Wildwood Shopping Center quaint with lots of independent shops


Weaknesses:

- Housing for younger demographic


Wants:

- Insufficient transportation capacity for planned development


Needs:


Needs:




- Any development should be safe for students

• Trees, green space, water features, low buildings, not much traffic


Needs:
