
## CHAPTER 7

## **COMMUNICATION**

Almost half of the respondents are aware that new master plans are being created for their

areas, 49 percent. An impressive 59 percent of North Silver Spring residents are aware of the planning process that is underway. Fifty-two percent of West Silver Spring and the CBD residents knew about the update to their master plans. Forty-seven percent of East Silver Spring and Takoma Park residents are aware, fewer than the area average. However, the lower percentage in East Silver Spring and Takoma Park may reflect the fact that area's planning process is starting a little later than the others.



- Seventy percent said that they would like to contribute their opinions during the master plan process. Interest in participation ranged from 75 percent among North Silver Spring residents to 71 percent among CBD residents to 66 percent in West Silver Spring. West Silver Spring residents generally identified few strong issues for their area and the percentage of renters is relatively high, second only to the CBD. Both of these factors tend to decrease interest in the planning process.
- Among the possible methods for participating in the master plan process, the favorite among those who said they would like to participate was telephone or written communication, 41 percent. Public meetings were next at 38 percent and civic association meetings garnered 11 percent. Most of the 3 percent who said "other" specified a combination of meetings, phone calls, and written communication. North Silver Spring residents liked civic association meetings better and calling or writing less well than the average. Results from the other three areas followed the overall pattern.
- One traditional resource for exchanging information between citizens, planners, and government officials involved in the master plan process is the civic association. This survey shows that only 28 percent of the respondents or persons in their households participate in civic

association activities. North Silver Spring residents are the most active in civic associations, 48 percent, while CBD residents at 13 percent and West Silver Spring residents at 18 percent are less likely to participate than the area average. One of the benefits of the survey is to reach so many people who do not usually participate through civic associations.

Newspapers are the most popular source of information about the neighborhood and the

community. Twenty-three percent of the respondents said that the Gazette was their primary source of local news and 20 percent the Washington Post. Word of mouth was next most important, mentioned by 15 percent. Civic association newsletters did not fare very well, only 2 percent mentioned these. All told, newspapers accounted for almost half of the responses, more than half in the CBD and West Silver Spring. Civic association newsletters were most important in North Silver Spring, 8 percent.


