
CHAPTER 3 **SECURITY**

Sense of Security

Given the emphasis on crime as a negative aspect of the area, it was reassuring to find that over 60 percent of area residents feel either "very" or "somewhat" secure walking in their neighborhoods after dark. Only about 10 percent said that they were "very worried." Although we don't have benchmarks, staff suspects that this level of sense of security would be fairly typical of most metropolitan areas in the context of the current level of concern about crime nationwide. It is also consistent with national reports that people are frequently



worried about crime in general but perceive their neighborhoods as safe. About 70 percent felt "very" or "somewhat" secure in the North and West Silver Spring Planning Areas. East Silver Spring and Takoma Park residents were the least comfortable about their safety, only 55 percent were "very" or "somewhat" secure, while 12 percent were "very worried." The CBD fell between the others, with a relatively low 7.5 percent "very worried" but 65 percent feeling "very" or "somewhat" secure. Residents of relatively urban areas probably have somewhat different expectations than those in less dense neighborhoods. For example, they may assume that they need to be very alert when walking at night. Consequently, "very" secure may have a somewhat different meaning in different parts of Silver Spring/Takoma Park.

• Overall, a slight majority have not changed their activities in their neighborhoods because of security concerns, but almost half report making changes. Fifty-two percent reported no changes while 47 percent said that they had limited their activities. East Silver Spring and Takoma Park residents were most likely to have limited their neighborhood activities, as 51 percent said they had. West Silver Spring residents were the least likely to have made changes, only 34 percent said they had.

• Almost 39 percent suggested more police as the way to address public safety in their neighborhoods. Twenty-nine percent had no suggestions, and 16 percent wanted better outdoor lighting. The responses were fairly similar among the four planning areas, except that both East Silver Spring and Takoma Park and West Silver Spring expressed a slightly stronger desire for better lighting than the other areas. Over 5 percent of respondents in both North Silver Spring and the CBD said they believe that "development or revitalization" would increase public safety in their neighborhoods.

Sense of Security by Age

- As might be anticipated, respondents aged 65 and over felt less secure when walking in their neighborhoods after dark than younger respondents. In every planning area, a smaller percentage of people 65 and over report that they feel "very" or "somewhat" secure walking in their neighborhoods than younger respondents. Less than half of older persons report feeling relatively secure compared to between 52 and 70 percent of younger people, depending on the planning area. Older residents of North Silver Spring were least comfortable walking after dark, only 33 percent said that they felt "very" or "somewhat" secure. Older residents of East Silver Spring and Takoma Park also had low levels of comfort and were the group with the highest percentage stating that they are "very worried," 25 percent.
- While older respondents feel least secure, they also have the fewest suggestions for improving the situation. Generally, they answered "no suggestions" or "don't know" more often than other age groups when asked for ideas for improvement. In addition, a smaller percentage of older people had limited their activities for security reasons than the planning area average in three of the four planning areas. Silver Spring CBD was the one exception.
